



Student Transfer Report

Fall 2010-Spring 2015 Analysis

FCC regularly collects data from the National Student Clearinghouse on students who have transferred to higher education institutions nationwide. Examination across semesters for the period of fall 2010 through spring 2015 showed that 4,859 students transferred to either a Maryland (approximately 70%) or an out-of-state institution (approximately 30%). Specifically, 58% (n =2,800) transferred to Maryland four-year institutions, 13% (n = 624) transferred to Maryland two-year institutions, 26% (n =1,244) transferred to out-of-state four-year institutions and approximately 4% (n =191) transferred to out-of-state two-year institutions (see Figure 1). Approximately, 83% of FCC's transfer students moved on to a four-year educational institution. Several institutions and students restricted gender and race data (n=82). These students are included in the total transfer count but not in the gender and race data at the end of the report.



<u>Transfers to Maryland Institutions</u>: Approximately 70% (n= 3,424) of FCC's students transferred to Maryland institutions during this period. The following table shows the number of students who transferred to two and four-year institutions (See Table 1). University of MD College Park, Hood College, University of MD University College, Towson University; and Mount Saint Mary's University attracted the most FCC transfer students.



Transfers to Out-of-State Institutions: Approximately 30% (N= 1,435) of students transferred to out-of-state institutions (see F2). During this period, the top ten states to which these students transferred were West Virginia (24%, N=338), Pennsylvania (18%, N=258), Virginia (14%, N=202), North Carolina (5%, N=78), New York (3%, N=50), District of Columbia (3%, N=49), South Carolina (3%, N=49), Florida (3%, N=47), Massachusetts (2%, N=28) and California (2%, N=26).




Other transfer destinations made up approximately 21% of Out-of -State Transfer Destinations (n=1077).

<u>Transfer Trend by Semester:</u> F3& T2 show FCC's transfer trends by semester from fall 2010 to spring 2015. FCC students tend to transfer and enroll in Maryland institutions during the fall semesters. Out-of-State transfers decrease during the spring. In fall semesters, an average of 859 FCC students transferred to new institutions. During the spring an average of 308 FCC students transferred.






Gender: There were 2,784 (57%) female and 1,973 (41%) male students who transferred to Maryland and $\underline{\text{oO}}$ ut-of-<u>sS</u>tate institutions from fall 2010 to spring 2015. The rate of transfer and enrollment at FCC by gender is similar. Among females, 71% (n = 1,972) transferred to Maryland institutions and 29% (n = 812) transferred to out-of-state institutions. Among males, 69% (n = 1,369) transferred to Maryland institutions and 31% (n = 604) transferred to out-of-state institutions (see F4).

Race/Ethnicity: Examination of transfer students by ethnicity showed that most were Caucasian (76%, n = 3,670) followed by African Americans (12%, n = 561), Hispanics (5%, n = 224), Asians (4%, n = 216), Native Americans (0.03%, n = 15), Hawaiian/Pacific Islander (0.05%, n = 23) and Other/Not Specified (2%, n = 82). White students make up a greater percentage of transfer students than they do in overall FCC enrollment.



<u>Transfer to Institutions based on Race/Ethnicity:</u> F6 shows the percentage of each ethnic group that transferred to Maryland or Out-of-State Institutions from fall 2010 to spring 2015. The data shows that for each ethnic group, a consistently larger percent of students transferred to MD institutions than to out-of-state institutions.
