What is internship education?

Internship education combines classroom learning with employment in a position related to a student's field of study. Internships are planned work experiences that offer students the opportunity to apply classroom knowledge in the workplace, earn 1-3 academic credits, and gain valuable resume-building experience. The internship program at FCC helps students gain new perspectives, skills, knowledge, and experience in the marketplace that helps them transition from college to entry-level careers.

Who is eligible?

Before applying for an internship, students must:

- Be enrolled in one of the FCC programs offering an internship
- · Have a minimum 2.0 grade point average
- Be approaching their last 15 credits in their college program

How does the internship process work?

The internship and apprenticeship coordinator and your faculty internship advisor will work with you to help make your internship successful. Here is a quick overview of the steps involved in the internship experience:

STEP 1: Schedule an in-person internship orientation meeting by contacting Carla Milan at 301.624.2724 or cmilan@frederick.edu.

STEP 2: Meet with your faculty advisor to discuss internship goals, outcomes, and expectations and complete the learning plan.

STEP 3: Complete the memorandum of understanding, obtain signatures of your internship employer and faculty advisor, and return to the internship education office in order to register for the appropriate INTR course. Standard tuition and fees will apply.

STEP 4: Complete the activities outlined in the internship education program student workbook throughout the internship experience, including the weekly log of work activities, summary project, and employer evaluation under the guidance of your faculty internship advisor.
