## Emergency Management A.A.S. - Track I: FEMA Independent Study

Provides students with a broad education in emergency management. Focuses on preparedness and the skills needed to organize and lead emergency management operations. Option I utilizes a prior learning assessment of the Federal Emergency Management Agency Independent Study courses and validation with distance education modules. This option requires students to demonstrate their learning through an instructor-led, five-week module with discussion boards, proctored exams, and college-level essays.
