ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING PROGRAM ADMISSION PROCEDURE TO THE **ADN** CLINICAL CLASS OR THE **LPN CERTIFICATE** CLINICAL CLASS Day Option

To be included in the pool of applicants for admission to the clinical portion of the nursing program (ADN and LPN), a student must apply by February 1st prior to the program start date. Applications are available on the college web site (www.frederick.edu/nursing). In addition, you <u>must</u>:

- 1. Complete all required developmental course work.
- 2. Complete BI 103, BI 104, and BI 120 by the end of the spring semester prior to the program start date.
- 3. Have all official transcripts from other colleges/universities sent to the Welcome and Registration Center by February 1st.
- 4. Take the TEAS exam and score Proficient by February 1st

Please note:

- 1. Points will be assigned only to those students who have returned the Clinical Application for the ADN Clinical Class or LPN Certificate Clinical Class and met the above four criteria.
- 2. Any non-science course(s) being repeated must be completed by end of the January term in order to count in GPA calculation for the day option or summer session for the evening/weekend option. If a student is completing a prerequisite science course during the application semester, the midterm course grade will be applied to the point scale (including transfer courses).
- 3. The students with the highest point total will be accepted conditionally into the clinical portion of the program and will be informed of their admission status by April 15th.
- 4. If any accepted student declines their seats in the program or fail to meet their fall course requirements, the next eligible student with the highest point score will be notified for placement in the program.
- 5. Students with equal point totals will be ordered by GPA* from highest to lowest.
- 6. If you will be enrolled in courses at another college during the Spring semester, you must include a copy of your current course schedule for the appropriate point value to be assessed.
- 7. Once grades have been posted in May, transcripts for those accepted conditionally will again be evaluated. Any student who dropped a course or failed to earn a 'C' or better will be re-evaluated. If, after the May re-evaluation, a person's new point total falls below the cut-off score for the AND/LPN Clinical Class, he/she will not be eligible for the clinical portion of the program and the next qualified person will be admitted.
- 8. Students not gaining admittance to the ADN Clinical Class or LPN Certificate Clinical Class and wishing to be considered for the next clinical class will compete within the general applicant pool.
- 9. A student who fails NU 101 and wants to return to a future clinical class will be offered the opportunity to join the pool of applicants for the following year.
