Other Maryland colleges that offer the Bachelor of Science in Social Work: Bowie, Coppin, Frostburg, McDaniel, Morgan & Washington College. UMBC has a Shady Grove campus; Salisbury has a Hagerstown campus

Hood: The FCC Human Services Area of Concentration satisfies all lower level core requirements at Hood, including the FCC Gen Ed Math. If students take MA 206 they will still need to take SOC 261 (Social Statistics) at Hood. Students who transfer to Hood College with a completed A.A. will have met Hood’s lower level general education core requirements, and will not need to take World Languages.

Salisbury: Students must apply to the BASW program – Requirements: 60 credits, Statistics (MA 206), General Psychology (PS 101), AN 101 or EC 201 or SO 101, 2.5 overall GPA, 2.7 in Social Work courses (HS 103).

Stevenson: Students can transfer up to 70 credits from FCC, although Federal Financial Aid will pay for only 60 credits toward the Human Services Associates Degree.

Advising

Students should meet with an advisor each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific academic goals and interests.

Completing the Pathway

Students who take fewer than 15 credits each semester or who require developmental English or math coursework will need additional semesters to complete their degrees. Summer and January term classes may help students to make faster progress.

General Education CORE courses can often be taken in any semester. One course must be designated as a Cultural Competence course. A minimum of nine credits must be taken at the 200 level. Refer to the college catalog (frederick.edu/class-schedules) for course details and the list of General Education and Cultural Competence classes.

Reverse Transfer
