#### **Transfer Institution Information**

University of Maryland University College offers an online Bachelor of Science in Psychology and has an articulation agreement with FCC. See the program manager for more information.

University of Maryland Baltimore County offers a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science in Psychology, and a double major in Psychology and Sociology.

**University of Maryland College Park's** Psychology programs are Limited Enrollment Programs (LEP) and offer both a Bachelor of Arts or a Bachelor of Science in Psychology. Students must complete gateway requirements (at FCC, PSYC 101 with "B-" or higher, BSCI 150 with "C-" or higher, MATH 175 or 210 with "C-" or higher) have a cumulative GPA of 2.7 or better at the time of application to the major.

Towson University offers a major in Psychology with options including a Clinical Psychology Area of Focus and an Honors Thesis in Psychology option.

Hood College offers a B.A. Psychology as well as a 5-year B.A./M.S. Program in Psychology & Counseling. Students who transfer to Hood College with a completed A.A. will have met Hood's lower level general education core requirements, and will not need to take World Languages, but students who transfer early should use electives credits to take World Languages 101 and 102 at FCC.

Frostburg State University offers a Major in Psychology with emphases in Addictions, Child & Family, and Leadership in Psychology.

Salisbury University FCC has an articulation agreement with Salisbury from Psychology to Salisbury's Social Work program. See an advisor for details.

**Stevenson University** FCC has an articulation agreement with Stevenson to the Bachelor of Science in Psychology. Stevenson will accept up to 70 credits from FCC, although Federal Financial Aid will only cover 60 credits of an Associate degree. See an advisor for details.

#### **Advising**

Students should meet with an advisor each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific academic goals and interests.

### **Completing the Pathway**

Students who take fewer than 15 credits each semester or who require developmental English or math coursework will need additional semesters to complete their degrees. Summer and January term classes may help students to make faster progress.

General Education CORE courses can often be taken in any semester. One course must be designated as a Cultural Competence course. A minimum of nine credits must be taken at the 200 level. Refer to the college catalog (frederick.edu/class-schedules) for course details and the list of General Education and Cultural Competence classes.

#### **Reverse Transfer**
