The Art program enables students to explore and develop areas of concentration which may lead to an associate in arts degree, transfer to a four-year college or university program, or to pursue individual artistic directions.

Art Area of Concentration within the A.A. in Arts & Humanities

The Art Area of Concentration allows students to experience hands-on learning in art history, 2D design, drawing, acrylic, oil and watercolor painting, color theory, illustration, sculpture, and pottery. Students will learn to appreciate the creative process and develop their talents under the guidance of experienced instructors who are professionals in their field.

Learning Outcomes

- To recognize the elements of composition, design, and technique of a work of art.
- To analyze and critique works of art within their cultural and historical context.
- To produce works of art in a variety of media.
- To demonstrate and appreciate the creative process through research, development, and execution.

Growth Potential & Estimated Salaries

The median annual wage for arts and design occupations was \$46,660 in 2018. Overall employment of arts and design occupations is projected to grow 3% from 2018 to 2028, slower than the average for all occupations.
