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Film & Video Production

The Film & Video Production program is designed for students whose career goals are oriented toward the mass media in the fields of multimedia production. Industry-standard software and equipment provides students with prevalent tools and hands-on training in the pre-production, production, and post-production of video. This program prepares students for careers in media production.

Film & Video Production Area of Concentration within the A.A. in Arts & Humanities

The Film & Video Production Area of Concentration is designed for students whose career goals are oriented toward the mass media in the field of digital media production, and prepares students for transfer to a four-year college or university.

Students in the Film & Video Production program are prepared for a variety of careers in the field of digital media production. Producing digital art in a variety of media and developing proficiency in current industry standard software prepares students for careers as video editors, producers, and camera operators. Job duties may include creating motion graphics, directing, lighting and operating equipment, and planning, shooting, and editing news and field production projects.

Film & Video Production Certificate

The Film & Video Production Certificate program is designed for students whose career goals are oriented toward the creative field of film and video production, including motion picture and television production, motion graphics, video marketing, web videos, and short- and long-form screenwriting.

Learning Outcomes

- Demonstrate proficiency in use of current industry standard software.
- Produce works of digital and interactive art in a variety of media.
- Demonstrate and appreciate the creative/problem solving process through research, development, and execution of digital media.
- Comprehend the responsibilities associated with professional behavior by participating in an internship.
- Enhance skills as critical thinkers, effective problem solvers, and effective ethical communicators who demonstrate professional behaviors consistent with industry standards.
- Demonstrate ability to plan, produce, and edit digital productions that reflect an awareness of current visual and interactive media standards appropriate for entry or intermediate level professional work.
- Demonstrate current digital media skills, procedures, and techniques in order to function successfully as entry-level employees in a professional production facility.

Growth Potential & Estimated Salaries

The median annual wage for film and video editors and camera operators was \$58,990 in 2018. Overall employment of film and video editors and camera operators is projected to grow 11 percent from 2018 to 2028, faster than the average for all occupations.

Internship Program

Internships help students integrate what is taught in the classroom with what is required in the workplace. Students take internships to develop knowledge and skills valued by employers. Students in the Film & Video Production program at Frederick Community College (FCC) are eligible to receive credit for internships.

Financial Assistance

Transfer Note
