KOC214 Kids Take Over the Kitchen

AGES 8-11, 10-13 & 12-15

Join us in this beginners course to learn how to properly set up a sewing machine, make adjustments, and operate it safely and responsibly. Each day students will learn new skills and complete an exercise, or small project, demonstrating what you have learned. You will be proud of what you will learn and accomplish during this class. Beware, you might be able to teach your family how to sew by the end of class!



Computers & Technology

KOC519 Touch, Type and Create

AGES 10-13

Keyboarding skills are a lot more enjoyable when you're practicing using fun projects. Learn how to type at a rate of 15 - 25 words per minute without making a lot of mistakes. Use Microsoft Office Word to become skilled at basic word processing, formatting, correcting errors, and proofreading your work. Practice cutting and pasting, changing fonts, underlining, using italics, and bolding. This interactive class will keep your fingers flying across your keyboard.

KOC634 Minecraft: Architecture - Seven Wonders Of The World

AGES 10-13

Combining the open world of Minecraft with the versatility of Legos, students will learn about various types of architectural wonder. From the Great Wall of China, to the Empire State Building, students will study about the architects who helped to create these masterpieces of craftsmanship, and then build their own. Students will begin by exploring building designs, and then use the computer to recreate them using Minecraft and Legos. Combining what they have learned with their imaginations, they will create their own architectural marvels, focusing on their own Wonder of the World.

KOC642 How to Build a PC

AGES 9-14

Building your own PC can be a cost effective and rewarding experience for anybody. In this hands-on class, students will disassemble and reassemble recycled PCs. They will learn to repair and troubleshoot issues as they build a PC from the ground up. Program installation is the next step and then it's onto use the PC for gaming and other tasks. Computer components and tools will be provided, but students do not bring home a PC.

KOC738 Minecraft: Coding

AGES 8-11

Learn some basic coding as you get a virtual robot to do the digging in Minecraft! Take on challenges with your friends and learn about conditionals, functions, and coordinates in your own Minecraft world.

KOC739 Minecraft: Collaborate

AGES 8-11 & 10-13

Building in Minecraft is more fun when you are sitting right next to a kid who's also in your virtual world. Work together with your friends to learn important social and collaborative skills as you build a real and virtual community.

KOC767 Minecraft: Survival & Civilization AGES 8-11 & 10-13

Collect and assemble resources, build shelters, and gather food and provisions, as you create and develop a society that grows individual hovels to whole cities. Share resources with your friends to build a civilization that can withstand the challenges presented to the class.

KOC216 Advanced Level Minecraft AGES 12-15

Would you like to challenge yourself in Minecraft and tackle something more complicated than a simple house or castle? How would you like to recreate Neuschwanstein Castle in 1:1 scale? No? Is that not difficult enough? How about creating the Titanic to scale? These and other ancient and modern wonders of the world will be examined and recreated in this advanced version of Minecraft Architecture. At the end of the week you will take a tour through, around, and inside the structures that have been recreated. Previous Minecraft experience is necessary to join this class.

LEGO[®], Robotics & More

KOC224 LEGO[®] Mindstorm Robotic Creations AGES 10-13

Join us as we set out for a week of exploring and building robots. Students will work in pairs to use LEGO[®] Mindstorms Robotics. Build a robot that will follow your commands, and modify and test various robot creations. KOC743 LEGO ® SPIKE

AGES 8-11

Learn to problem solve through complex challenges with your own ideas and intuitive coding as you create with LEGO® Education SPIKE kits. Whether you already know about coding with LEGO® kits or this is your first try, it's going to be fun. You will work collaboratively through a variety of experiences that help build confidence and STEM knowledge about everyday problems and observations.

KOC749 LEGO [®] SPIKE: Cube Solvers

AGES 12-15

General Program Information

Students learn more when they have the opportunity to discover and explore exciting topics in a fun, hands-on environment. That's where we come in. We provide expert instruction, a safe environment, and all the supplies for a fun-filled summer of learning. To ensure everyone enjoys their time at Frederick Community College, we ask that you please read through the following Kids on Campus (KOC) rules and guidelines.

Drop Off / Pick Up

The Conference Center (Building E) and the Visual & Performing Arts Center (Building F) are the two places where students can be dropped off and picked up. Please check your child's classroom to see which location is best. There are guiding signs and a campus map available.

Sign In / Sign Out Procedure

Student Sign-In Procedure

Due to the large public open campus environment and our concern for student safety, we require that parents/guardians accompany students to their designated classroom and personally sign in their student with a staff member for each scheduled day of camp. Students cannot be checked into their classroom until 10 minutes till (8:50am or 12:50pm). Students cannot be left in our care until they are signed in.

Students 13 and older may sign themselves in once a completed Self-Sign In/Out Form is on file with the Kids on Campus office. Please contact the office to complete a copy or the instructor will have one available when you sign your student in for class.

Student Sign-Out Procedure

All students must be signed out at the end of each class. Students 13 and older may sign themselves out if there is a Self-Sign In/Out Form on file for them. No student is permitted to leave the classroom until signed out by a parent or guardian, a KOC staff member, or permission by the Self-Sign In/Out Form. If students remain after class 15 minutes after camp is over (12:15pm, 1:15pm, or 4:15pm) the student will be escorted to the Conference Center Building Lobby to sit with Kids on Campus staff member until pick up.

For your child's safety, any additional adult (outside of parent/guardian on file) picking up them must be added to the Authorized to Pick-Up list. The adult will be required to present proper photo identification during sign-out before the child can be released in their care. It will also be the parent/guardian's responsibility to inform KOC if a name needs to be removed from the Authorized to Pick-Up list.

Lunch Bunch

If your child is signed up for a morning and an afternoon class, they must also be enrolled in Lunch Bunch to provide consistent supervision. If you do not wish to participate in Lunch Bunch you must pick your child up for lunch and sign them in for their afternoon class. Students participating are escorted by Kids on Campus staff from their morning class to Lunch Bunch, and then to their afternoon class.

FCC does not serve lunch during Kids on Campus programs. Students must bring a non-perishable lunch and drink with them to campus each day. Please note: Refrigeration is not available for packed lunches.

Dietary Allergies

Frederick Community College cannot provide an environment free of food that may trigger allergies including but not limited to nuts, wheat, soy, or eggs. Parents/guardians who enroll a student with severe dietary allergy in the Kids on Campus program assume all risk and responsibility.

KOC Refund Policy

College cancellation of class(es)

Students will automatically be refunded 100% of class tuition and fees if a class is cancelled by the College. The annual registration fee of \$9 is only refundable when FCC cancels a course, and the student is not registered for any other course.

Student Initiated Drop/Refund Request - Within the Refund Period

Students wishing to drop a CEWD Kids on Campus class will receive a full refund, excluding the \$9 annual registration fee provided the request is received 7 days prior to the class start date.

Students have two methods to drop a class

• Log into https://frederick.edu/QuickEnroll and follow the directions under How to Drop a Class on the Payments & Refund page. Selfdrops are available online during the refund period, which is (7) days prior to the class start date.

• Email ceinfo@frederick.edu any time prior to the refund deadline. The drop/refund request must be initiated from the email address associated with the student's account and must include the date and course title for the drop to be initiated.

Please note

- Requests for drop/transfers or refunds cannot be honored by voicemail.
- Refunds are not issued for children dismissed from a program for disciplinary purposes.
- Refunds will be processed back to the credit/debit card on file, all other payment methods will be issued by check to the address on file. Updates from the registration office will be provided to the email address on file. Please allow 10 - 14 business days to receive your refund.

Student Initiated Drop/Refund Request - Outside the Refund Period

Students seeking a drop/refund for a class outside the refund period can initiate the request for extenuating circumstances by completing the Drop/Request Form at frederick.edu/CEWDdrop. Students will be asked to provide documentation supporting the student's request. Appropriate documentation may include electronic or hard-copy documents from medical providers, employers, childcare providers, or others that can validate extenuating circumstances. The college reserves the right to approve a full, partial, or deny a refund request submitted outside the full period for the class.

Transfer Requests

Students whose class has been cancelled or are electing to drop a class during the refund period may choose to transfer their funds toward an alternate class.

- The request to transfer must include the new course, including class start date. Email requests to ceinfo@frederick.edu. Or visit us on the main campus, in Jefferson Hall Building.
- Transfers are dependent on class availability.
- If there is a difference in price between the original class and the new class, this difference will be refunded or billed to the student and must be paid in full prior to the class start date.
- Transfers are not possible after the refund period has ended.

Medications/Emergencies

FCC Staff are not authorized to administer any non-emergency medication (prescription or non-prescription) to students. Emergency medications can be administered by FCC staff with written authorization from a physician and parent/guardian. Emergency Medication includes a rescue inhaler or epi-pen. The Medication Administration Authorization form can be found at www.frederick.edu/youth. Completed forms should be sent to youthprograms@frederick.edu. If non-emergency medication must be taken while the student is on campus, the parent/guardian is responsible for coming to campus to administer the medication.

Emergency Medications are not kept overnight at Frederick Community College. The medications will be required to travel with the student. They will need to sign in and out of class with the student. If they are registered for a full day of camp, our staff will handle the travel of medications from AM class to Lunch and then to their PM class. Parents are expected to sign the medication in the morning with the student and out at the end of the day. Medications cannot remain on campus!

In emergencies requiring immediate medical attention, your child will be taken to the nearest hospital emergency room. Your signature below authorizes the person responsible at Frederick Community College to have your child transported to that hospital.

Bathroom Procedures

All Students at FCC must have independent personal care skills. KOC staff does not provide personal hygiene assistance. Frederick Community College is committed to providing equal opportunity and access for students with disabilities by removing barriers to participation and providing reasonable accommodations. Disabilities can include but are not limited to learning, attention, hearing, vision, psychological, chronic medical, and physical. Students under age 13 must be accompanied to the bathroom by a KOC staff member. A staff member will accompany the student to the bathroom location and wait outside in the hallway until ready to be escorted back to class. Instructors may also arrange scheduled bathroom breaks for the class to walk together with a KOC staff member.

Responsible students over 13 may go to the bathroom in pairs. Running in the hall, goofing off in the bathroom, making too much noise – are examples of irresponsible behavior. If any age child is exhibiting these types of behavior, the student will be required to go with an escort.

Behavior Policy

All members of the FCC community regardless of disability/challenge (i.e. physical, learning, psychological, emotional, behavioral, etc.) or medical condition, must abide by the rules and regulations of our Student Code of Conduct and our Visitor Code of Conduct. Any inappropriate behavior (by instructors or staff members, parents, or students) will be dealt with immediately. All disruptive behaviors will be reported to FCC Security.

In the event that a student does not demonstrate appropriate behavior, the following procedures will take place (not all steps may be taken; some may be skipped):

- Verbal warning
- Removal from peers/activity to discuss concerning behavior.
- Removal from room/group to address expectations to return to the group.
- Parent/guardian contacted.
- Removal from Kids on Campus class(es) and/or remaining summer programs without refund.

Students are expected to maintain attention to the tasks, follow directions of instructors and staff, as well as regulate their behavior to ensure a functional learning environment for all students. Students can be temporarily suspended or expelled from the program if their behavior is continuous or serious in nature (i.e., physical violence) or if it is disrupting or having a negative impact for the other students within the class or group. All behavior incidents will be documented and kept securely in the KOC Office. Parents/guardians will be notified via phone or email of all behavior incidents. If a student is temporarily suspended or expelled from the program, a refund will not be provided.

Kids on Campus maintains a zero-tolerance policy toward violence

and bullying: The program reserves the right to dismiss without refund any student who disrupts the classroom experiences of other students with violence, bullying, or other inappropriate behavior, and any student who refuses to cooperate with FCC instructors or staff.

"Bullying" is abusive conduct that is threatening, unwelcome, aggressive, hostile, intimidating, harassing, and/or unreasonable behavior that demeans, mentally or physically intimidates, or humiliates people either as individuals or as a group. Bullying is typically a repeated course of conduct but may occur as a single incident. Bullying can be conducted by an individual or multiple individuals. Bullying may, but need not, result in physical harm; emotional and/or psychological harm; economic harm; and/or reputational harm. Bullying is not limited to conduct between individuals with a certain relationship. For example, bullying may be peer to peer, subordinate to supervisor, supervisor to subordinate, and faculty/ employee to student, among other relationships.

Bullying includes, but is not limited to:

Verbal/written bullying, such as ridiculing, insulting, verbally abusing, or maligning a person, either in person or in writing; making abusive, threatening, or derogatory remarks to or about a person; and/or attempting to exploit an individual's known intellectual or physical vulnerabilities; and

Cyberbullying, such as bullying an individual using any electronic form, including, but not limited to, the internet, e-mail, cellular phones, and/or other electronic resources.

Visitation Policy
