






Cost of attendance (COA) – Expected family contribution (EFC) = Financial need

Borrowing Student Loans

- Students must be enrolled at least half-time (six or more required credits) in an eligible program to borrow federal student loans
- There are <u>annual loan limits</u>
- Loans must be repaid with interest
- <u>Different types of loans (subsidized vs. unsubsidized)</u>
- <u>Parent PLUS Loans</u> credit-based
- Borrow responsibly
- Loan Simulator coming soon!



Requesting Loans at FCC

- Submit your 2021-2022 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Complete the 2021-2022 Loan Request Form
 - Don't forget to complete <u>Entrance Counseling</u> & sign your <u>Master Promissory Note (MPN)</u>
- Allow time for processing
- Monitor your PeopleSoft To-Do List
- Accept your loans in PeopleSoft



Did You Know?

The U.S. Department of Education Requires schools to implement specific policies that can impact students depending on their performance.

Examples:

- <u>Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)</u>
 - Specific GPA & Completion Rate
- Return to Title IV (R2T4)
 - Aid can be returned if deemed unearned
- Attendance
 - Must be verified for Federal Student Aid (FSA) eligibility
- Courses Not Used (CNU)




Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Collects demographic & financial information
- Information used to calculate the expected family contribution (EFC)
- Colleges & scholarship organizations use the EFC to determine eligibility for financial aid
- Available in English & Spanish
- Prior prior year (PPY) tax data used
 - 2021-2022 FAFSA will use 2019 tax & income data

Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID

- Used for FAFSA completion & allows access to certain U.S. Department of Education websites
- May be used by students & parents throughout the financial aid process, including subsequent school years
- Create your FSA ID here: <u>https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm</u>
- Parent & student both create a FSA ID (must use different email addresses)
- The FSA ID should be created 2-3 days prior to starting the FAFSA



Student Dependency Status

Will you be 24 or older by Jan. 1 of the school year for which you are applying for financial aid? For example, if you plan to start school in August 2021 for the 2021–22 school year, will you be 24 by Jan. 1, 2021 (i.e., were you born before Jan. 1, 1998)?

- Are you married or separated but not divorced?
- Will you be working toward a master's or doctorate degree (such as M.A., MBA, M.D., J.D., Ph.D., Ed.D., etc.)?
- Do you have children who receive more than half of their support from you?
- Do you have dependents (other than children or a spouse) who live with you and receive more than half of their support from you?
- 6 Are you currently serving on active duty in the U.S. armed forces for purposes other than training?
 - Are you a veteran of the U.S. armed forces?
- At any time since you turned age 13, were both of your parents deceased, were you in foster care, or were you a ward or dependent of the court?
- Are you an emancipated minor or are you in a legal guardianship as determined by a court?
- Are you an unaccompanied youth who is homeless or self-supporting and at risk of being homeless?



*If you don't answer "yes" to any of the questions above, you're still considered a dependent student for purposes of applying for federal student aid even if you don't live with your parents, are not claimed by your parents on their tax forms, or are paying for your own bills and educational expenses.



WHO'S MY PARENT WHEN I FILL OUT MY FAFSA?

Dependent students are required to report parent information on the *Free Application for Federal Student Aid* (FAFSA).¹ For reporting purposes, "PARENT" means your legal (biological or adoptive) parent or stepparent, or a person that the state has determined to be your legal parent.

Use this guide to figure out which parent's information to include (depending on your family situation).







Signing the FAFSA

- Required
 - Student
 - One parent if student is dependent
- Options for submitting signatures
 - Electronic using FSA ID
 - Signature page
 - This option must be used by students of parents who are undocumented



Frequent FAFSA Errors

- Social Security Numbers
- Name mismatches
- Divorced/widowed/remarried parental information
- Income earned by parent/stepparent
- Untaxed income
- U.S. income taxes paid
- Household size
- Number of household members in college



What Happens Next?

- FCC will receive your FAFSA as long as you include our school code (002071)
- Check your mail as well as your PeopleSoft To-Do List
- Follow-up with the Financial Aid Office
- Review Financial Aid page of College's website



Financial Aid Verification

- Random selection
- Verification Groups
- Students required to submit different types of documents (ex: tax documents, high school completion, identity, etc.)



Financial Aid Verification Process at FCC

- FAFSA received
- Notifications mailed
 - "Tracking" letter is mailed to the address on file if verification is required
 - Loan only letters mailed to students who are only eligible for loans
- Students submit the documents as outlined in their PeopleSoft To-Do List
- Financial Aid Counselor completes verification
 - Corrections may be made to the FAFSA based on the verification documents submitted
 - The Financial Aid Counselor may email the student's myFCC email account to request additional documents
- Student is awarded estimated aid in PeopleSoft



Special Circumstances

- Death of parent(s)
- Unusual/uncovered medical expenses
- Loss of employment
- Divorce
- Extraordinary dependent care
- Student cannot obtain parental information







Maryland State Financial Aid Application (MSFAA)



The <u>Maryland State Financial Aid Application</u> (<u>MSFAA</u>) is available to students who are ineligible to receive federal aid using the FAFSA.

Students who are unsure of which application (FAFSA/MSFAA) to complete, should complete the MSFAA eligibility wizard within MDCAPS prior to starting either application.

The priority deadline for the MSFAA is also 3/1/2021!



Maryland State Financial Aid Application (MSFAA)

The MSFAA allows qualified children of undocumented immigrants, who qualify for in-state tuition under <u>§15–106.8 of the MD Education Article</u>, to apply & be considered for certain types of State need-based financial aid.

- Guaranteed Access Grant
- Campus Based Educational Assistance Grant
- Part Time Grant
- Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship, the
- Near Completer Grant

- 2021-2022 will be the 3rd year of this program
- High school applicants must have earned an unweighted cumulative GPA of at least a 2.3 or its equivalent:
 - at the end of the first semester of their senior year in high school; or
 - at the end of their senior year in high school.
- Applicants currently or previously enrolled at a community college must have earned either:
 - a cumulative GPA of at least a 2.5 from the community college; or
 - a high school unweighted cumulative GPA of at least a 2.3 or its equivalent at the end of the first semester or end of their senior year in high school.



- Submit a completed 2021-2021 FAFSA/MSFAA by 3/1/2021
- Any high school graduate or GED recipient who is planning to enroll, or is currently enrolled, at a Maryland community college as a candidate in:
 - a credit-bearing vocational certificate;
 - a credit-bearing certificate;
 - an associate degree program;
 - a sequence of credit or non-credit courses that leads to licensure or certification; or
 - a registered apprenticeship program.
- Applicants must be eligible for in-state tuition, as determined by the community college in accordance with Title 15 of the Education Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland;

- Applicants whose annual adjusted gross income was not more than:
 - \$100,000 if the applicant is single or resides in a single-parent household; or
 - \$150,000 if the applicant is married or resides in a two-parent household for the 2019 tax year as defined by MHEC;
- Applicants who have not earned a bachelor's degree or an associate degree; &
- Applicants who have not been awarded other state financial aid, Federal Pell Grant, &/or Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) that covers the full cost of the tuition & fees at the community college



- In prior years, Promise was not awarded until after the non-payment drop date, so families should prepare to pay
 the balance out of pocket/set up a payment plan until Promise is confirmed
- MHEC will require students to submit supporting documents pay close attention to email/text alerts for deadlines
- Promise is not guaranteed there are funding limitations (20/21 = \$8 million)
- You must attend the community college in the county/area you are from unless that community college does not offer the program you plan to pursue
- Maryland Promise is limited to \$5,000 per year
- Maryland Promise does not cover the cost of books/supplies
- Students must enroll full-time (12 or more credit hours per semester)


