

Pre-Health Professions: Associate Degree in Nursing

Application Deadlines:

Daytime Cohort: February 1st *

Evening & Weekend Cohort: September 15th *

1. **Apply to the College:** Apply to FCC and declare Pre-Health Profession Nursing as your major.
2. **Submit Official Transcripts:** Send official college/university and high school transcripts, SAT & ACT scores as well as any CLEP, IB or AP scores to the Registration and Records Office.

*Note that official college/university transcripts should be sent upon application to FCC, and must be sent by application due date for the Nursing Program (see deadlines above) **

3. **Apply for Financial Aid:** Apply for Financial Assistance – Submit the FAFSA and apply for scholarships.
4. **Complete Placement Tests:** Complete FCC placement tests as needed - consult with Admissions or Advising.
5. **Complete Pre-Admission Courses:** Complete the following requirements with a grade of C or higher*

ENGL101 (EN101) – English Composition
MATH – MATH120 Statistics or Higher
COMM - general education communications elective
ARTT - general education arts elective
PSYC101 (PS101) - General Psychology
SOCY101 (SO101) - Introduction to Sociology

EDPS210 (ED/PS208) - Human Growth & Development
HUMANITIES - general education humanities elective
[Science prerequisite: BSCI55 or BSCI150 or CHEM101]
BSCI201 (BI103) - Anatomy & Physiology I **
BSCI202 (BI104) - Anatomy & Physiology II **
BSCI223 (BI120) - Microbiology **

*** Sciences must be completed by the end of the semester in which application is submitted to the Nursing Program. The sciences cannot be enrolled in more than twice each in the five years leading up to the application deadline (withdrawals, audits, and grades of D or F all count as an enrollment), and none can be older than 5 years at the application deadline.*

One (1-3 credit) PHED, HLTH or NUTR course is required to earn the Associate Degree in Nursing. Three-credit NUTR102 (HE102) or NUTR200 (HE200) Nutrition is recommended to fulfill this requirement for students interested in the dual-admission RN-to-BSN partnership with Frostburg State, Towson, or the University of Maryland School of Nursing (UMSON).

6. **Complete the TEAS:** Prior to applying to the Nursing Program, complete the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) and earn a score that qualifies your application for review.
 - **Minimum qualifying TEAS Score – all scores must be achieved on the same test:**
 - Overall score in the proficient range or above (minimum 58.7% overall)
 - Minimum math score of 69%
 - Minimum reading score of 69%
 - **The TEAS can be taken twice each application cycle** if necessary to earn a qualifying score, but there must be 30 days in between attempts.
 - **Register for the TEAS through atitesting.com;** take the TEAS at FCC's Testing Center.
 - If completed previously, a qualifying TEAS score **cannot be older than 2 years at application deadline.**
 - **If applying by February 1st deadline,** prepare for the TEAS during the fall semester, **take the TEAS in December prior to applying, and retake in January prior to applying,** if necessary.
 - **If applying by September 15th deadline,** prepare for the TEAS during the spring semester, **take the TEAS in July prior to applying, retake before the September 15th application deadline,** if necessary.
7. **Submit Application and Qualifying TEAS Score to the Nursing Program:** Access the Nursing Program application through the FCC Nursing Program website (Frederick.edu > Nursing > Enroll > Apply). Complete and submit the application with a qualifying TEAS score by the application deadline (see deadlines above). **Applicant must submit a qualifying TEAS score with the Nursing Program application.**

* Final pre-admission courses, including sciences, can be in progress the semester application is submitted.

Criteria for Admission to the ADN Clinical Class

Anatomy & Physiology I, Anatomy & Physiology II, and Microbiology may each be enrolled in twice, including withdrawals, audits, and transfer credits, in the 5 years preceding the application deadline. Students repeating any of these science courses or their lab components more than the allowed number of attempts within 5 years of the application deadline will not be awarded points for the applicable course, regardless of grade earned, and will be ineligible for FCC's Nursing Program.

All courses must be completed with a grade of C or better. All sciences must be completed with a grade of C or better and cannot be older than 5-years at the application deadline.

Anatomy & Physiology I (BSCI201 / BI103): A = 8 points, B = 7 points, C = 6 points

- midterm grades are counted for courses in progress

- course must have been completed within 5 years of the application deadline

Anatomy & Physiology II (BSCI202 / BI104): A = 8 points, B = 7 points, C = 6 points

- midterm grades are counted for courses in progress

- course must have been completed within 5 years of the application deadline

Microbiology (BSCI223 / BI120 or BSCI263 / BI203): A = 8 points, B = 7 points, C = 6 points

- midterm grades are counted for courses in progress

- course must have been completed within 5 years of the application deadline

Cumulative GPA (including transfer credits): 3.5 or higher: 2 points, 3.0 - 3.49: 1 point
