

Transition-to-RN Program

For Army Medics, Air Force Technicians, Navy Corpsmen, Paramedics, and
Licensed Practice Nurses

Application Deadline: May 1st

1. **Apply to Frederick Community College and declare Nursing as your major; Apply for financial aid.**

2. **Send official military, college/university, and high school transcripts, SAT & ACT scores as well as any CLEP, IB or AP scores to the Welcome Center.**

Note that official military and college/university transcripts should be sent upon application to FCC, and must be received prior to application due date for the Licensed Practical Nurse-Paramedic-Military-to-RN Transition Program*

To have previous college or university transcripts sent, contact the Registrar's Office at your previous institution to arrange for official transcripts to be sent to FCC's Admissions Office. Contact your high school for high school transcripts. Contact CollegeBoard.org for SAT, ACT, CLEP, IB, or AP scores

3. **Complete FCC placement tests as needed.** Contact FCC's Admission Office for guidance.
4. **Complete the following prerequisite requirements with a grade of C or higher.***

EN101 – English Composition

A college level general education math elective

A general education communications elective

A general education arts elective

PS101 - General Psychology

SO101 – Sociology

ED/PS208 - Human Growth & Development

A general education humanities elective

[Science prerequisite: BI55 or BI101 or CH101]

BI103 - Anatomy & Physiology I **

BI104 - Anatomy & Physiology II **

BI120 – Microbiology **

***** These sciences cannot be attempted more than twice each in the five years leading up to the application deadline; None can be older than 5 years at the application deadline; all must be completed at the time of application to the Transition Program.***

[A 1-credit PE or 3-credit health course does not need to be completed prior to applying to the Nursing Program; however, one is required to earn the Associate Degree in Nursing. HE102 or HE200 Nutrition is recommended.]

5. **Complete the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) with an overall score in the proficient range (58.7% - 78%) and a minimum of 69% specifically on the reading portion.**

The TEAS can be taken twice each application cycle if necessary to earn needed score, but there must be 30 days in between attempts. FCC will have spring dates available for the TEAS. If completed previously, TEAS score cannot be older than 2 years at application deadline. Courtney Sloan in the Learning Commons can help with TEAS preparation. Contact her 2-3 months prior to taking the TEAS. FCC's Bookstore sells a TEAS preparation book.

6. Submit application and TEAS score by May 1st and make an appointment at the Testing Center for the math aptitude test.

The Testing Center will offer one week of math aptitude test appointments for the math aptitude test. The test offers applicants the opportunity to earn up to 2 additional points on the point scale for admission into the Transition-to-RN program. On the Nursing Department webpage under the “Math Testing: Applying for Admission” tab, you will find a math aptitude practice test and conversions to memorize prior to taking the test. You are welcome to print out the practice test and meet with a math tutor in the STEM Learning Center for assistance preparing. Check FCC’s Nursing webpage under the “Math testing: Applying for Admission” tab or your advisor for exact test dates.

7. Next Steps and Additional Information:

- Transition applicants must, at the minimum, be through A&P I, II & Micro with grades of C or higher by the May 1st application deadline.
- Transition applicants must submit their applications and TEAS scores to the Transition Program by May 1st. Applicants take the math aptitude test immediately following the application deadline.
- FCC’s Transition Program is a selective/ competitive admission program; all applicants will not be admitted.
- Applicants are advised of their admission status on or about June 1st.
- Accepted applicants have the option of completing NU50 during the summer session.
- Fall Semester: accepted applicants must enroll in NU105 – Pharmacology (2-credits) and have the option of also enrolling in additional nursing prerequisites as needed.
- Spring semester: accepted applicants must complete 3 online APUS Transition Courses: Fundamentals of Nursing, Med-Surg I, and Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing.
- Summer: accepted applicants who successfully complete APUS courses during the spring semester progress into a 2-credit clinical course.
- Fall and Spring: accepted applicants who successfully complete the summer 2-credit clinical are eligible to progress into the last two semesters of FCC’s daytime Nursing Program to complete the Associate Degree in Nursing.

Criteria for Admission to Transition Program

BI103/104/120 may each be repeated only once, including withdrawals, audits, and transfer credits, in the 5 years preceding the application deadline.

Students repeating any of these science courses more than the allowed number of attempts will not be awarded any points for the applicable course, regardless of grade earned.

All sciences must be completed with a grade of C or better within 5 years of the application deadline.
