Checklist for Spouses and Dependents Using Transferred Entitlement [Post 9/11 GI Bill[®] (Chapter 33)]

Required steps for spouses and dependents using a transferred Post 9/11 GI Bill benefit:

*Please submit any documents containing personally identifiable information using the <u>Secure Document</u> <u>Submission form</u> or you may bring documents with you to an in-person intake appointment.

- **Submit the following military documents to Veteran and Military Services (VMS):**
 - a. Certificate of eligibility (COE) and Department of Defense Transfer of Entitlement document
 - If you are using your benefit for the first time and have not yet applied for it, fill out <u>VA Form 22-1990e</u> (Application to Use Transferred VA Education Benefits). You should *"start your application without signing in."* Submit your COE to Veteran and Military Services once you receive it.
 - ii. **Submit your Department of Defense Transfer of Entitlement (TOE)** document to expedite your enrollment certification
- □ Fill out FCC's free online application for admission <u>here</u>.
- □ Submit official transcripts and/or score reports to FCC's Registrar's Office to be evaluated for credit and <u>determine if you are exempt</u> from the reading, writing, and/or math placement tests. For information about how to submit them go <u>here.</u>
 - a. Submit official transcripts from any colleges and/or universities where you earned credit
 - b. Submit SAT, ACT, or AP score reports if they exempt you from taking the placement tests or yield credit (AP)
- **Submit unofficial copies of college/university transcripts to VMS for advising purposes if possible**
- Take the placement tests if you are not <u>exempt</u>. For information about how to take the tests go <u>here</u>.

- Optional: Apply for federal student aid to see if you are eligible to receive a need-based Pell Grant.

- Schedule an intake appointment <u>here</u>. Please submit as much of the required documentation as possible prior to your appointment or bring it with you to an in-person appointment. We will ask for your SSN, which is required for VA enrollment certification, at your appointment. For security purposes, please do not email it to us! ***We do NOT need to have all of your documentation on file before you register for classes.
