

What is CLEP?

CLEP is a series of examinations that allow individuals to earn college credit for what they know, regardless of where they learned it. CLEP is the most widely accepted credit-by-examination program in the United States.

CLEP examinations are all 90 minutes long, except for the English Composition, which is two hours.



Register for your CLEP

Create an account at clepportal.collegeboard.org/myaccount

Once you have registered for your test, contact the Frederick Community College (FCC) Testing Center to pay your \$30 testing service fee and schedule your appointment. Be sure to indicate your military status, as you may be eligible for a testing service fee-waiver.

Bring a copy of your CLEP Exam Registration Ticket to your appointment. You must have this ticket in order to test.
